

Eau Claire Fest Celebrates Arts and Community

The Eau Claire Community Council and the City of Columbia present Eau Claire Fest, an annual celebration of arts and community, on Saturday, May 11, 2013 in the historic Eau Claire Town Center at North Main St. and Monticello Rd.

A springtime tradition since 2008, Eau Claire Fest (formerly Ribs & Renaissance) will feature local performers including indie soul artist Collette Blakeney, whose North Columbia connections will bring her back to her roots with a special appearance at Eau Claire Fest. Other artists include Jahson and the Natty VibeZ, a popular local Reggae band; Alternacirque, the Southeast's premiere neo-circus company founded in Columbia; and the Post-Timey String Band with its unique, blend of folk, ragtime, and blues.

Bringing back a tradition begun with the Eau Claire Centennial in 1998, a parade through North Columbia's commercial district will take on a spirited revival as the "Fonky Fest Parade" and will feature traditional entries such as the Eau Claire High School No Half-Stepping Marching Band and the JNROTC Color Guard, as well as the Puppy Parade from the NOMA Bark Park. The Parade begins at 11:00 A.M. at the intersection of North Main Street and Sunset Drive and will travel 1/2 mile to the site of Eau Claire Fest at North Main Street and Monticello Road.

Following the parade, visitors will enjoy a day-long excursion into our village where visual and performing artists will be telling the story of the roots of this historic community. As part of Columbia's year-long Civil Rights Initiative, Columbia SC 63, an interactive archive of film and images from the height of Columbia's Civil Rights era will be presented by the University of South Carolina and Historic Columbia in the historic Eau Claire Print Building.
