2 Rev. Joseph Lowery named President, SCLC, succeeding Ralph Abernathy, 1977.

3 The Freedman's Bureau for Black Education founded to aid establishment, 1865.

4 Dr. King announced the Poor People's Campaign's civil disobedience in D.C., 1968.

5 Alexander Crummell founded the American Negro Academy of lit. science and arts, 1897.

6 Dred Scott decision denying Blacks US citizenship handed down by Supreme Court, 1857.
